#### **CHAIRS REPORT-JANUARY 2020**

Welcome to another decade! I hope you had a good Christmas. The lead up to the Christmas holidays can be a jolly but stressful time of the year. So now that the holidays are over, I personally am glad that we can get back to regular routines which are so vital to so many of our loved ones with autism.

I recently noticed in magazines and newspaper articles that a theme or "resolution" for 2020 was "Be Kind to one another". I suppose that this is because of the chaos in this world and in this country. At first I thought how sad it is that people need to be reminded to be kind to one another. On the other hand it made me feel quite grateful to those who set up this Charity so many years ago. These were parents and carers who, whilst searching for information and support to help them care for their own loved ones with autism, decided to form an organisation that would "unite & pass it on" to others like them. It also made me feel proud and grateful to all you volunteers, friends, family and members today, who give of your time and efforts to continue running this Charity. Over 15 years ago, when my daughter Angela was diagnosed at age 3 1/2 years, I found the Jigsaw LAS subgroup, and an independent group in Leicester City called "Reality". The kindness and support I received from the members of both groups is the reason that today I give my time and efforts to this Charity's' mission of helping others. I truly hope that we can continue this Ethos and that people who access our services can experience the same kindnesses as I did those years ago.

So, as this year begins, we will continue to focus on that mission, and we hope to add more information, support, and learning opportunities to families of all ages. Whether it's with our groups, activities, training, Helpline, Linkup newsletter or even signposting to other groups and organisations.

I also need to clarify the area we serve, as there seems to be some misunderstanding by folks in parts of this County. To clarify, as our name states, the **LEICESTERSHIRE AUTISTIC SOCIETY** volunteers serve the entire County, including Leicester City and Rutland. We do not discriminate based on the location where one lives. Our goal is to work in partnership with other organisations and groups everywhere to provide the best support to you families. Jigsaw is a subgroup of the LAS, as is the Charnwood Autism Support group, and most recently formed the Melton Mowbray Spectrum Support Group. (Info in this issue). We work in partnership with so many other organisations, charities and community groups with the sole purpose of helping families.

As a not-for-profit Charity, we ask that you help us by being a Member at a cost of only £5 per year. Everything we offer is run solely on donations and outside funding. Donations were received in the last 3 months as funding or tombola prizes for activities. Many thanks go to ASDA Fosse Park, Boots Wigston, Blaby District Council, Leicestershire County Council, and parent carer Charlie Littleton, who for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year organised a Christmas Autism Awareness Ball to benefit Jigsaw and the Market Harborough Support Group called Spectrum.

In March, Leicestershire's Autism provisions, resource centres, Learning & Support Team and the NAS are holding a Conference at the Leicester Racecourse. The theme is around Inclusion of Young People with Autism in Mainstream Schools. It is open to professionals, parents and carers, but advanced booking and a discounted (non-refundable) fee of £20 for parents carers and £60 for professionals must be made via Eventbrite and the Autism Support Team. Planning is also underway for **April Autism Awareness Day and Month**. <u>Session A:</u> <u>SPELL framework & impact on pupils – MAP (Maplewell school Autism Provision)</u>

Cast a SPELL - SPELL is The National Autistic Society's framework for understanding and responding to the needs of young people on the autism spectrum. It focuses on five principles that have been identified as vital elements of best practice in autism and emphasises ways to change the environment and our approaches to meet the specific needs of each young person.

OR

<u>Session B:</u> <u>Maintaining relationship – Footsteps (All Saints Primary</u> School, Wigston Autism Provision)

Working Alongside Parents - The presentation will highlight the importance of working alongside parents to ensure the social, emotional and educational progress of all children is a collaborative approach. Through engaging therapists, support staff and counsellors in discussing their children to create a workable picture of the whole child both at home and school. It will highlight the progress made in school but also at home, whilst focusing on where and how schools can impact the lives of the vulnerable children we work with

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

<u>Session C:</u> Friendship & Relationship Skills – Excel Autism Provision, Wigston Academy

**Using the Talkabout™ programme**, we have developed a social communication skills package teaching and reflecting upon our students' friendship & relationship skills. We focus on identification of their friendship/relationship skills & qualities then lead tailored group activities to suit their needs. Topics covered include work on; Friendships — qualities, trust, conflict. Feelings, actions & consequences, peer pressure; relationships — self-esteem, girl/boyfriends, expressing feelings & peer pressure.

#### OR

### <u>Session D:</u> How to make friends – ERP Autism Provision, Iveshead School, Shepshed

The session will explore how making friends and social interaction can be supported in young people who find this challenging. We will investigate what can be done in practical terms to help navigation of social land-scapes and scripts. We will also investigate how we can help with understanding and avoiding inappropriate and damaging relationships.

### <u>Session E:</u> Comprehension and Inference in Reading and Listening – Rawlins Academy (Autism Provision)

Understanding and teaching comprehension and inference in reading and listening for autistic children within mainstream schools.

### OR

### <u>Session F:</u> <u>Transitions – Cleveland House Autism Provision – connected to Hinckley Academy</u>

Transitions are often difficult for people on the autism spectrum and their families. Children, young people and adults with a diagnosis of ASD usually rely on routines to navigate situations, and a change; such as beginning school, changing school or getting used to a new routine can cause high levels of stress and anxiety. We will focus on how to plan a transition to a new environment, giving hints and tips that can be transferred to different situations.

### <u>Session G:</u> Adaptations to environment – Birchwood Autism Provision, Birchwood Special School

Making Your Classroom Work For You: Creating an environment that supports positive behaviour and maximises learning opportunities. This talk will include information and resources on:

- Why autistic children and young people may find the classroom environment difficult to access.
- Reasonable adjustments that can be made to the environment to improve outcomes for autistic pupils.

How to set out an autism friendly environment.

# <u>Session H:</u> <u>Discussing the diagnosis – Autism Outreach Team</u> A key step for many of our children is understanding the meaning behind their diagnosis. In this workshop the team will discuss different approaches, resources and ideas for tackling discussion about their diagnosis. Views of young people will be shared and opportunity for discussion about this process will take place.

### Autism Friendly Kibworth, sharing experiences in Kibworth

On 28<sup>th</sup> September over 80 people from Kibworth came together to celebrate the different lives of people and families living with autism and the wider spectrum the condition displays.

The community event was organised by a group of local residents involved on raising awareness about or affected by autism; their aim is to have better communication amongst themselves but also within the village, share experiences and improve the lives of families, carers and individuals within the spectrum of autism in Kibworth. The group wanted to acknowledge families and individuals, give them an opportunity to better know each other and learn from their experiences.

The main event was hold at the café, The Well, which includes some volunteers within the spectrum of autism; music by local artists, donated cakes and a positive atmosphere contributed towards people feeling comfortable to share their experiences but also to consider ways to improve communication and peer support.

One of the suggestions that emerged from the day was the intention to create a carers networking group that could meet twice a month in The Well initially. The purpose will be to exchange impressions, support each other and have some respite as carers.

These sessions will be delivered by the interested residents, supported by each other, and managed in a rota basis, so the caring of their dependants during these sessions is also shared. People attending the community event on 28<sup>th</sup> September agreed on the importance of being able to share experiences, ideas and issues in a safe and local setting, easy to reach and where they can be welcome.

Emma Dowman, is the manageress of The Well, who hosted the event.' Local shops displayed in their shop windows multi-coloured, multi-shaped hands, symbolising the diversity of people living with the condition. A brief list of actions that businesses and people in general can do to make a friendlier environment for people with autism was also on display the shop windows. It is now being considered to roll this out to other businesses and to show it in a more permanent basis.

Autism Friendly Kibworth is supported by the local Parish Council. Dr Kevin Feltham, Chairman of the Parish Council, created a Facebook page to raise awareness about autism and support residents wishing to get involved. The local bookshop displayed and sold books about autism on a variety of aspects and welcome joining the local initiative.

### NEW !! Saturday PLAY CLUB for young persons with Autism & SLD or PMLD

In partnership with the WELL CAFÉ in KIBWORTH we are hosting a **Play Club** for young people with Autism **and** severe or profound and multiple learning difficulties in a relaxed environment. There is a safe and enclosed garden which can be used, weather permitting. Every young person must be accompanied by a parent or adult carer.

Another goal of the Club is to provide carers of the young persons with Autism, SLD and/or PMLD an opportunity to meet and have a cuppa and chat with other carers whilst their young person enjoys supervised play in a safe environment. Carers have reported to us that it is difficult for them to attend mainstream and even other ASD friendly activities geared towards individuals with no or moderate learning difficulties. The severity of the



young persons' Autism and learning difficulties makes it nearly impossible for carers to see other carers in a supportive environment during the weekends. Parent carers reported that autism friendly holiday activities and evening or daytime parent support groups are impossible to attend with their young person or without due to lack of qualified and available care.

We will start with 1 Saturday per month from 2 – 4pm. Activities will include sensory play materials and games, music, exercise and movement in a safe environment. We will work with advice and support from Carers, Teachers, Art Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Music Therapists, and the Autism Outreach Team. Once we have a Leader and Support Worker, the anticipated start date is **Saturday 14**<sup>th</sup> **March 2020**





On FRIDAY 14th FEBRUARY, we will mainly be having a 'just us' meeting - Sarah Preston and I have been very aware over the last few meetings that the LCC Teams come along and tell us how things 'ought' to be working and we know that that just isn't what is happening On The Ground. This was particularly the case with our November meeting, when the Non Res Finance Team came out and again at the meeting this week with Supported Living. So we want to take an hour or so to find out exactly what is happening to us all - with Transport, with benefits, with colleges being offered, with Social Care and with funding.

Also, the meeting this week was wonderfully attended - thirty or so parents - but those who were there saw that that meant a certain level of chaos with not enough tables/chairs/space/time to find out what was happening. So in February, we're just going to take a deep breath, drink coffee, eat biscuits - and also get some idea of problem areas that families are facing that we need to get LCC to come along and talk about. We might also have Claire McWilliams, the Transitions Team Manager, coming for the second half of the meeting to answer all your Social Care queries.

On TUESDAY 10th MARCH, we have Mariana Senior from Advance UK coming to talk about HOLT. This is a scheme, mentioned at the Supported Living meeting, whereby a property can be purchased by anyone with a long term disability. Most of us had never heard about it and there wasn't time to cover it properly at the meeting but Advance UK are the company who run the scheme. We are also expecting to have at least

one member of the LCC Supported Living Team back as well too - to explain how Social Care & benefits fit into living in a property that you have bought.

On **TUESDAY April 28th, we have Marie Harris from SENA** back again to talk all things education - how to get a third or a fourth year at college, EHCPs, out of County placements etc.

And do let me know if there is anything else that you would like covered.

I have attached some information that Shirley Jones, the Supported Living Commissioner who came to our meeting in January, has sent through. **Annie Bannister** 

Information below from the info given out by Shirley Jones (see above)

### What is supported living?

It's a combination of housing and support services, provided to enable people to be as independent as possible, to have choice and control over where they want to live, who they want to live with and the support they receive.

About 360 people who are in supported living - 70/80% are adults with learning disabilities and the remainder have physical or mental health support needs.

The majority of people are aged 18 - 65 years with a small number of older people currently in services.

### What sort of needs do people in supported Living have?

### **Learning Disability**

A learning disability impacts cognitive and behavioural development that is likely to affect the level and method of communication, speech development, understanding and awareness of physical environment, keeping safe and decision making. Potential impact on capacity to make decisions in relation to particular circumstances and for some there is also an impact on sensory perception.

#### **Autism**

Autism is a lifelong, developmental disability that affects how a person communicates with and relates to other people, and how they experience the world around them. Autistic people see, hear and feel the world differently to other people. It is a lifelong spectrum condition, with no known cure but good support can improve a person's quality of life. Some people with autism may also have learning disabilities, mental health issues or other conditions meaning people need different levels of support.

#### **Mental Health**

Most people at some point in their lives will be affected by mental health issues, either by experiencing deterioration in their mental health themselves or via supporting a family member or friend. Mental Health issues can affect individuals in a range of ways, the degree to which mental health deterioration will impact on a person's thinking, feelings and behaviour will depend on the nature of the issue. For example whilst there might be common issues, no two individuals will experience depression in the same way. Mental health service users often experience fluctuations in their mental health, so have good weeks and bad weeks.

Mental Health service users often require support around motivation, engaging and building trust, keeping safe, and developing and maintaining healthy coping strategies. Support may also be required around managing routines and developing hope and control over their lives.

### How do you make the decision on who moves into supported living?

Detailed assessments are completed that involves the professionals involved in the person's life, their circle of support (family/parent/carers) and the person themselves.

The location and type of Scheme is also taken into account as an area may be suitable for someone as it is close to their network of support, they may be familiar with the area or the level of support that will be provided in the scheme is the most appropriate for them as not one size fits all.

### Where are people who would move into supported living accommodation currently living?

A number of people are living in the family home and the plan is to move so they can benefit from having their own home and becoming independent or they may need to move due to a change in circumstances for their parent/carer such as ill health, long term effect of caring or following bereavement.

Others will be supported to move out of institutional care (residential care) to live in the community with the right level of support.

### What support do people in supported living get?

- Developing practical skills in managing the home
- Looking after yourself and staying well;
- Social Inclusion:
- Vocational; education, personal development, training, volunteering and employment

### Who are the providers and where are they based?

We have a Framework in place with five providers who support people living in the following areas;

Hinckley	Aspirations Care

Melton	Lifeways Community Care	

There are other Support Providers available that a person can choose to have in place by using a direct payment.

### Why are you planning to increase the amount of supported living accommodation available across the county?

We are working to increase the amount of Supported Living Schemes across the County to give the people who we support an increased opportunity to live a life with the right level of support and opportunities to become members of a community. Achieving this relies on having the right offer of accommodation in locations that people want to live in with access to public transport and local amenities as well as less busy areas as not one size fits all.

### How is Supported Living paid for?

**Rent:-** In most cases is covered by housing benefit or universal credit **Living expenses/Utilities:** these will be paid by the individual from their income
