- Identifying gaps in learning and addressing them as swiftly as possible
- Promoting a love of reading
- Providing a broad, rich and meaningful curriculum
- Providing opportunities for children to plan, problem solve, self-organise, self-evaluate and analyse
- Draw out positive models of personal development, resilience, character, achievement and adaptation to challenges
- Provide routine and structure
- Ensure children are not overburdened
- Emphasising quality over quantity where purpose and achievement are the priority
- Increased opportunities for outdoor learning

## You Can Help Us By:

- Reading the COVID section of the website
- Parking legally and mindfully outside the school, especially on the estate near the Oak Drive gate
- Standing in the correct zones during drop off and pick up and exiting via the marked walk ways
- Not entering the zones where children line up or crossing them to exit
- Using our one-way system around the school unless you are the final drop off/collection
- Dropping your children off and leaving without waiting for the line to leave if your child is happy
- Arriving no earlier than 10 minutes before your drop off or collection time
- Not allowing your children to climb trees, use any benches or equipment whilst waiting outside
- Social distance around the school

#### Communication

We will be communicating to you through our website, emails and texts. The COVID tab is the first place to check for all organisational matters and update letters. Should your child be off school and not ill, then learning will either be e-mailed or made available via the Home Learning section as soon as possible.
