Using this platform can support:

- Book choices to foster a love of reading
- Decoding at the appropriate phase
- Shared reading
- Pointers for comprehension and inference
- Vocabulary development
- Establishing interests in new authors
- Discussion around content

### **Home Learning Reminders**

- You are required to attend the morning check in, if for any reason you can't please contact us to register your 'attendance' by 11am at the absolute latest. This is a daily requirement
- If you haven't accessed the above sessions, we'll need to contact you to find out why, as children are expected to engage in both these and the work set on, a daily basis
- We are expected to provide 3 hours a day on average for Key Stage 1 across the cohort, (with slightly less for younger children) and 4 hours a day for Key Stage 2. Our full offer details will be on our website from Monday
- We can support you with all ICT needs and issues to get you up and running. It is essential that we support you to get to this point as paper copies will only be issued on a temporary basis in certain circumstances
- Please report any safeguarding issues to the school or by following the guidance on our website if out of hours
- If you need paper, books or pencils etc. please contact the office
- Inform us of any ICT hardware issues that would prevent you from accessing the platform or our live Teams Check-Ins and Feedback sessions
- Please ensure children are paying attention on Teams calls as they would in class not eating, lying down or engaged in other activities. We also ask that there are no toys and teddies on the call!
- Where possible follow a structured daily routine with your child, ensuring that work is completed and submitted on time and in line with the expectations set by your teacher

# Remote Learning

## **Remote Learning Agreement**

Thank you for supporting your child in completing their test homework task on the Satchel One Learning Platform. In the unfortunate event that your child's bubble closes, your child has to isolate or there is a whole school closure, it is important that you have read and agreed with the following:

### **On-line Safety**

- All teachers have been briefed on the safe delivery of on-line learning. We have
  a shared responsibility to keep children safe on-line whilst educating them.
  Please support us with this by:
- Making sure children are dressed appropriately in day-time clothing, are supervised and are not in bedrooms
- Teachers or parents can mute or end sessions at any time if a situation occurs or they feel uncomfortable
- Parents or children must not record, video or share any parts of these sessions
- High standards of behaviour are expected at all times

### **Expectations & Guidance**

- Structure your child's day to support both success and mental well-being we will support you with this by providing a daily time table
- Support your child with their work but don't do it for them!
- Set clear time periods for your child to 'do their best', the teacher will have given an indication of how long each task should take.
- Your teacher will provide 3-4 pieces of work a day, usually Maths, English and another, this work may be supported by videos and written instructions
- Daily Reading is expected the school's Oxford Owl online reading library will support this, via a class login.
- The work will be ready by 9am each day
- Feedback will be provided for certain tasks, this may take the form of: Online answers, written feedback, verbal feedback on live sessions, celebration sessions where work is shared.

## Remote Learning

- For whole class closures there will be a live daily check in time between 9 am and 10:30am and a live feedback session between 2pm and 3:15pm—all exact times will be communicated to you as and when necessary
- Where the expectation is that work is submitted back to the teacher via the Satchel One platform, this will be made clear
- Where there is no submission, we will be required to contact you and offer support
- Written feedback and email communication will only be provided between 8am and 8pm
- We will require daily contact with pupils who aren't in school. If this is not possible through the check-ins described above, there will be phone calls home
- The class emails will remain open for general school and work related issues
- More general questions and concerns should be directed to the admin email address as usual
- Safeguarding issues must be reported to a DSL via telephone. If this is out of hours then you should follow the link on the school's website
- It is expected that you are contactable during the school day
- We ask that work set is completed to the best of your child's ability
- Please communicate with us if your child is struggling to complete any work
- Remember we are here to help and recognise that educating your child from home is not easy! We want to work in partnership to try and get it right for you.
