An Inspiring Curriculum...

Our children are fully immersed in their learning and enjoying the exciting topics and journeys planned for them by their teachers. Year 6 children are learning about life at the time of the second World War and in year 5 'The Victorians' is a theme and the children are considering the question: what would my life be like if I lived in 1865? In year 4 children are, amongst other themes considering climate change and in year 3 children are learning all about The Celts and The Romans. Our year 2 children are learning about Traditional Tales and composing their own 'Twisted Tales', while in year 1, children are learning about the 'Secrets Of The Seashore'. Our Youngest learners in EYFS are following a 'Marvellous Me' theme and particularly enjoyed learning about The Colour Monster last week: making monsters in all colours, shapes and sizes!
