Key Vocabulary

ritual	a religious or solemn or serious ceremony consisting of a series of actions performed in a set order
Ceremony	a formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event, achievement, or anniversary.
Sacred	connected with God or a religious purpose and so deserving respect
Belonging	A feeling of a connection to a place or situation.
Initiation	the action of admitting someone into a special group, usually with a ritual.
Bar mitzvah	the initiation ceremony of a Jewish boy who has reached the age of 13 and is thought to be ready to follow religious rules and fit to take part in public worship.
Bat mitzvah	a religious initiation ceremony for a Jewish girl aged twelve years and one day, which is thought to to be as the age of religious maturity.
Dharma	An idea in Hindu (and Buddhist tradition) about the eternal nature of reality, regarded as cosmic law (ideas about the universe)
Moksha	being released from the cycle of rebirth set by the law of karma
Baptism	the Christian ceremony of sprinkling water on to a person's forehead or of immersing them in water, symbolizing purification (being made spiritually 'clean') and being admitted into the Christian Church.
