- Hindu's use diva lamps, rangoli patterns, fireworks to celebrate Diwali.
- Christians believe that Jesus is the light of the world.
- Christians use candles and tree lights to celebrate Christmas.
- Christmas is a special time for Christians to rejoice over the birth of Jesus. Christians believe he was very special, not an ordinary baby but God on Earth.
- The story of Jesus' birth includes: 

   An angel visits
   Mary (The Mother of Jesus).
   Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem.
   Jesus is born in a stable and is placed in a manger.
   Angels appear to nearby shepherds.
   The shepherds visit baby Jesus in the stable.

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Diwali	The festival of light celebrated by Hin- du's and Sikh's across the world.
celebrate	To take part in enjoyable activities for a particular occasion.
diva	A small oil lamp (usually made from clay)
exile	To be made to stay away from home
rangoli	Colourful patterns made on the floor. Diva lamps are placed on the pattern .
Christmas	The Christian festival that celebrates the birth of Jesus. Christmas Day is celebrat- ed on 25th December
Advent	Is when Christians start to prepare for Christmas.
Bethlehem	The place of Jesus's birth.
