Brass	Blown instruments made of brass: Trumpet, Trombone, Horn, Tuba
Strings	Instruments with 4 strings & a bow Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass
Percussion	Tuned /untuned instruments that are shaken, scraped or hit
Fanfare	A short, showy piece of music usually played for a special event
Rap	Words spoken in a rapid, rhyth- mic way
Rock'n'Roll	Musical style from 1950/1960's developed in America
Reggae	Musical style from Jamaica in the late 1960's
Disco	1970's popular music to dance to
Нір Нор	Music style from the 1970s
Hand Jive	A dance from the 1950s
