## Key Vocabulary

<b>Bible</b>	The religious book that Christians follow.
<b>Gospel</b>	The first four books from the Bible, means 'Good news'
<b>Fisher of people</b>	What Jesus asked his disciples to do - to spread the Gospel to catch people's hearts.
<b>Disciples</b>	Followers of Jesus during his life
<b>Outcast</b>	someone who has been rejected by their community or society
<b>Samaritan</b>	A charitable or helpful person.

## What I will learn...

- Some texts that come from the Gospel telling the story of the life and teachings of Jesus.  
e.g. Jesus calling the first disciples (Matthew 4:18-22)
- Know about Jesus' actions towards outcasts.
- Know some examples of Christians showing love for all.
- Know some Christian stories from the Bible e.g.
  - The healing of the leper
  - The Good Samaritan



## Making a difference at The Merton

What kind of world did Jesus want? Children will listen to and discuss some important Bible stories reflecting on what Jesus' actions suggest about the kind of person he was.

They will think and discuss what qualities Jesus was portrayed as having and which of these qualities they would like to have, thinking about character and how they can make a difference to others through their actions.
