Attendance

I hope you have had time to read the letter from Dean Pomeroy, Director of Schools for the Trust around expectations on attendance. It is difficult to authorise any kind of holiday and there is an increased expectation Nationally that parents are fined where there are a number of un-authorised absences in any 6 month rolling period note this automatically includes any 5 day holiday. With this in mind, we ask that you do not take your child out of school unless it is absolutely essential. We are looking to achieve an attendance level of over 97% to enable children to progress to their full potential and this is a hard target to achieve when taking into account authorised absences such as illness etc. A huge thank you to those who arrange medical appointments (where possible) and holidays outside of the school term and support both school and their child's education through good attendance.

Before and After School

Can we ask that children wait next to their classrooms or with parents/ carers and do not stand on the hill or play across the field at the start and end of the day.
