What I already know...

In EYFS I started to develop my understanding of technologies as I explored how different materials and objects work in different ways for different purposes.

I have used computers with the support of an adult to help me to click on different icons on a computer program.

What I will learn...

To give examples of computer technology around us eg:

Mobile Phone: Press buttons to call and message people. Washing machine: Program it to clean clothes Microwave: Press buttons to tell it to heat food.

Key Vocabulary

keyboard	Lets you type letters and numbers on
mouse	lets you select and move objects. On a laptop, this is called a track-pad .
screen	This shows what the computer is doing.
technology	Anything made by people to help us.
base unit	Stores and processes information
cursor	This is an arrow or line on the screen that you can move with your mouse.
backspace	This lets you delete and edit text.

We will develop our basic skills to get us ready for our collaborative Digital Sea Art unit, as we learn how to change the colour and thickness of the paintbrush, and use this to create simple pictures and use the keyboard to add text, such as our names to show our digital ownership. We will learn to save our work and open it again to add to it in the future. As we grow in confidence using computers, we will be start to make careful considerations about what we can do to make sure our experiences when we use them are safe, through exploring why we have rules in school and how those rules help us, and then apply this understanding to rules needed for using computer technology safely and create posters to help us to remember these.
