Making a difference at The Merton

As we start our Year One learning journey we discuss rights and responsibilities, and choices and consequences at The Merton. The children talk about being special and how to make everyone feel safe in their class as well as recognising their own safety. We learn how to be a good friend through collaborative team building tasks in the great outdoors. Through our class text Sharing a Shell, we learn to think about what we bring to our year 1 team, what character traits help us to flourish and when we need to draw on the strengths of our friends. We learn playground games and how to include others in our play. We recognise both our uniqueness and our ability to develop amicable play and friendships as we build up a bank of playtime games.
