What I will learn...


- The importance of Creation on the timeline of the 'big story' of the Bible.

- Weigh up how far Genesis 1 creation narrative is in conflict or is complementary with a scientific account.






Key Vocabulary

creationism	The religious belief that nature, and aspects such as the universe, Earth, life, and humans, originated with a god.
Genesis	The first book of the bible describing the creation of the heavens and earth.
Big bang theory	The scientific theory that the Universe began in a Big Bang about 14 billion years ago.
Conflicting	Where two things are in opposition to one another.
Complementary	Where two things complete or
