## Key Vocabulary

Sketch map	A simple map with only basic details.
Key	Helps us understand map symbols.
Map symbol	A picture or sign on a map that represents a physical or human feature.
Route	A way of getting from a start point to a finish point
Physical feature	A feature that has been formed by nature.
Human feature	A feature that has been made or changed by humans, e.g. bridges.
Aerial view	A view from above. Also known as a 'bird's-eye' view.
Aerial photos	Are taken by aircraft or other flying object eg. Drones.
Satellite photo	Are taken from a satellite in space.
