Ephemeral work

The art of making two or three dimensional form through the use of techniques such as carving, modelling, sewing, assembling.

Two-dimensional figures which have height and width but no depth.

Three-dimensional, or having three dimensions; it is solid, not like a piece of paper. The threedimensions are length, width and height.

A work of art made by gluing or assembling pieces of different materials to a flat surface.

The act of using senses to play close attention to something.

Artwork that uses shot-lived materials

What I will learn...

- Monet was a French impressionist who painted nature.
- That Monet, who was born on the 14th November 1840, was the initiator and leader of the impressionist style of art.
- Rather than creating their work in a studio, impressionist artists took their artwork outside.
- Impressionism reflects and 'impression' of what a person, atmosphere, object or landscape look like to the artist.
- Goldsworthy is a British sculptor who uses resources from the natural environment (ephemeral works) to create artwork.
- That natural materials can be layered to create texture when making 3D art.

Having focused predominantly on dry media in the Autumn term, children will further develop their confidence and control with a range of media, including items collected from nature, poster paint and collage materials. Inspired by their study of the natural world, children will create different 2D and 3D depictions of the Earth's most extreme environments, as well as the natural disasters that they are learning about.
