



# Year 4 - Spring - Art Knowledge Organiser - Sculpture

## What I already know...

- how to roll a ball of clay and how to roll a long cylinder.
- how to pull, pinch and squeeze clay.
- how to carve details into clay with tools.

## Key Vocabulary

coil	Length of clay rolled in a spiral.
Pinch pot	Small pot made by pinching the sides of a ball of clay.
pliable	When the clay is soft and easy to mould into shape.
score	To scratch marks across two pieces of clay to help join them.
blunt	Not sharp
Varnish	Clear coating added at the end to help protect it.

## What I will learn...

- about the artwork of famous sculptors such as Picasso and Gormley.
- that clay can be used to make practical items such as bowls and cups as well as decorative items such as sculptures.
- to develop their sculpting techniques such as pinching, pulling, rolling, cutting, scoring, joining smoothing.
- how to create different textures.
- to give their opinions on their own and other people's work.
