## What I already know...

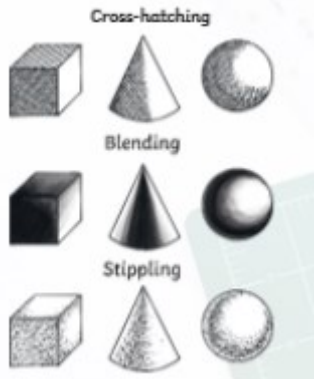
- How to draw using pencil.

## Key Vocabulary

tone	The general effect of colour or of light and shade in a picture
scumbling	Controlled scribbling.
hatching	Shading with closely drawn parallel lines.
cross hatching	Shade an area with intersecting sets of parallel lines.
stippling	The art or process of drawing, using numerous small dots or specks.
blending	The action of mixing or combining things together.
Contour hatching	Follows the contour of the shape.
<b>Pointillism</b>	<b>A technique of painting in which small, distinct dots of colour are applied in patterns to form an image</b>

## What I will learn...

- How to use a variety of sketching techniques (hatching, cross-hatching, contour hatching, scumbling and stippling) in a pencil drawing.
- About the artwork of an artist.
- How to create different tones using shading with pencils.
- How to create different tones using paints-colour mixing.
- How to use charcoal to create different tones.
- How to create a piece of work using pointillism
