Making a difference at The

The children will deepen their previous knowledge of Easter and use this to understand the Pentecost. They will understand why the Pentecost is important to Christians and the impact of this event and how important it is to Christians now. They will be encouraged to think about some of the emotions the disciples could have been feeling and consider how they might have felt at different parts of the religious story. They will think about what one body, many parts might mean and use art to explain their understanding of some Christian stories. They will consider how they are one part of The Merton and how they can make a difference to their own and other people's lives.
