

Making a difference at The

During this topic we will be listening to and engaging with a range of stories that allow them to express their thoughts and opinions about themselves. Providing opportunities for children to re-tell or re-act relevant stories independently and with adult support— through the use of books, actions, puppets and our small world area. The home corner will allow children to role play and develop their language and communication through the interaction they have with their peers. Children will be encouraged to use their voices to also take on the roles of different characters in stories, or use their imagination to create new characters. Lots of opportunities for questioning such as -What has happened? Why are they there? What is going to happen next? Encourage children to create own stories.

To begin the children's literacy journey this term, they will start by drawing a self-portrait. They will then transition onto one of our key texts called the 'Colour Monster', where they will explore their feelings and order the story. We then move onto our 'Only One You', where children will discuss what makes then unique and skills they are good at. They will also look at a senses non-fiction text and explore their senses and draw how they use them. 'Peace at last' will be our first fiction text after the half-term where children will learn the story using Talk4Writing and write a caption. Children will learn about and label woodland animals through our 'Percy the Park Keeper' story. They will also learn about people who help us and their roles in our community.
