Our **Understanding the World** journey will allow the children to learn about themselves. They will identify similarities and differences between themselves and their peers. They will use their senses to explore the classroom environment and outdoor learning opportunities through feely boxes, senses trail, eye spy, taste testing, sound walk. Children will learn about their body and what our different body parts do—this will link to our 'Hospital' role play area. Children will explore different habitats, animals and traditions. Children will explore what life is like in the woods through a variety of key text fiction and nonfiction texts. They will go on nature hunts and learn about animals and their habitats. Children will learn about how animals survive in the woods and what they might find in the woods. Children will also label the parts of an animal and write facts about animals. Children will also learn about traditions and festivals such as Fireworks night, Diwali, Remembrance Day and Christmas.
