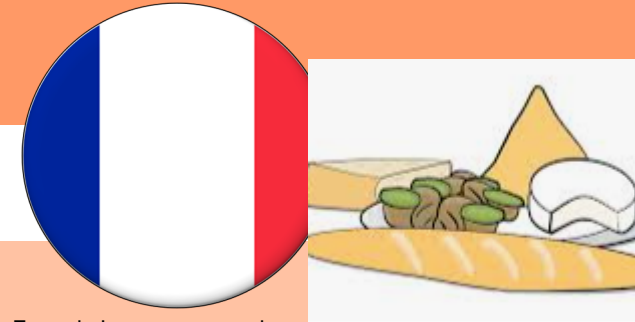


Year 5 - Autumn - French Knowledge Organiser

Making a difference at The Merton

This term, the children will continue their “flight path through France” by applying their previous knowledge and skills of the French language to this exciting topic of food and drink! Links can be made through topic based learning including Design and Technology. During this learning journey, children will ask and answer basic questions related to food and drink, begin to learn about masculine and feminine nouns and learn which version of the determiners the, a, an and some to use. Lessons will continue to focus on children’s developing listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in French. There will also be opportunities to apply their previous learning to this new topic when engaging in conversations with others. This year, there will be a key focus on phonics and pronunciation of the individual sounds as well as retaining vocabulary knowledge.
