What I already know...

Where we live. I know that some environments are different to the ones we live in. I know about different places in the world and how they are different. I understand that some materials are waterproof. I know some materials float and sink. I know about animals and their habitats. I can draw information from a simple map. I have an awareness of the creation story.

What I will learn...

To know what farms are for— what do they do and provide.

To have an awareness of what life is like on a farm and the different responsibilities a farmer would have.

To know about different animals that live on a farm and their young.

To understand what farms produce.

To learn about the lifecycle of a chicken.

To understand what crops need to grow.

To learn about farm machinery and the harvest

To know about farming in the past and present.

To know about different celebrations and how they are celebrated (Mother's Day/Easter).

To name about talk about the different seasons.

To know the names of a infant and adult farm animal and be able to match them.

To understand how animals are cared for on a farm.

Key Vocabulary

Direction	A direction is the general line that someone or something is moving in.
Farm House	A farmhouse is the main house on a farm, usually where the farmer lives.
Barn	A barn is a building on a farm in which crops or animal food can be kept.
Months	A month is one of the twelve periods of time that a year is divided into eg. January or February.
Seasons	The seasons are the main periods into which a year can be divided and which each have their own typical weather conditions.
Countryside	The countryside is land which is away from towns and cities.
Farm	A farm is an area of land, together with the buildings on it, that is used for growing crops or raising animals











Our Understanding the World journey will allow the children to explore what life is like on a farm and how it has changed over time. The children will learn about the role of a farmer through the story 'Farmer Duck'. They will explore different sensory farm set-ups in our small world area using shredded paper, rice and oats. Our creative, cross curricular approach will also allow them to use 3D shapes to build a barn for the animals and create their own field for harvesting using blocks and tractors. The children will also learn about where food comes from, they will explore the different textures of fruit and vegetables through their senses and learn how they grow. There will be a 'Vegetable Garden' messy play where the children can use their imagination to explore their gardening skills using tools, soil and vegetables. During this topic the children will also have the opportunity to plant some seeds and learn the importance of looking after them, they will be harvested in the summer term. The children also go on a farm trip. Throughout this topic we will also have a focus on celebrations such as shrove Tuesday, Mother's Day and Easter, where they will produce their own cards and create Easter baskets.
