What I already know...

In EYFS we have explored and experimented with the use of line when we created our self-portraits and still life artwork and also during ample opportunities to develop these further when we were learning around the room and in our enhanced provision.Last term we immersed ourselves in the work of Hokusai, we learned and about relief printing, tints and shades and Hokusai's use of lines to create our own Great Wave.

What I will learn...

Stephen Wiltshire is a British artist who was born in 1974. He is known for his drawings of cityscapes. He can draw from memory after seeing a scene for a very short time. When he was three, he was diagnosed with autism and communicated with others using his drawing as he could not talk.

We will also learn:

To use our sketchbooks imaginatively to gather and collect ideas

To draw using pencil and pen using linear, scumbling, shading, side strokes and feathering

To use a wide variety of media to develop different textures when producing collages

How to be an Artist....

To use pencil and pen skills to draw:

- horizontal and vertical lines
- Side strokes


To use carefully use collage to add a pop of colour

Key Vocabulary

Stephen Wilshire	Is a British artist who is known for his drawings of cityscapes from memory.
drawing	A picture or diagram made with pencil, pen or crayon using pencil
linear	drawing using only narrow lines
scumbling	shading using tiny circles and scribbles
side stroke	using the side of a pencil with light pressure
feathering	a series of short lines that appear to be a single line
collage	a piece of art made by sticking various different materials to a background
mural	A large painting usually drawn on a wall.

- hatching
- cross hatching
- scumbling
- feathering
