## What I already know...

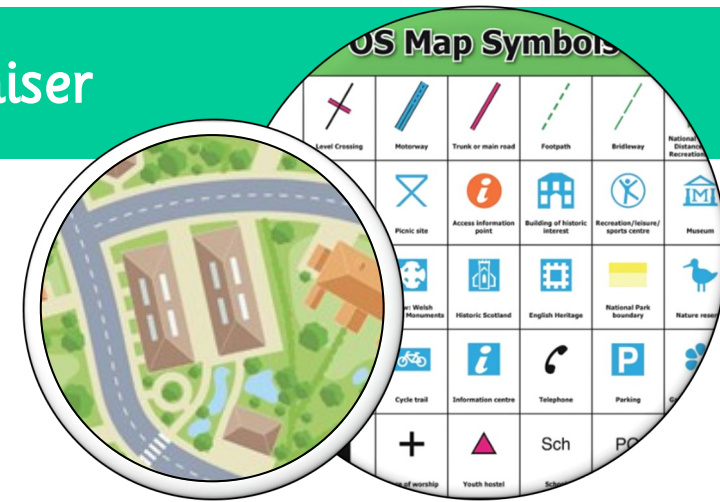
- How to sketch a map with basic details
