How to be an artist...

Exploring and developing ideas: To explore the roles and purposes of artists, craftspeople and designers working in different times and cultures. To make thoughtful observations about starting points and select ideas to use in their work.

Drawing: To use sketching skills to plan, refine and alter their drawings as necessary.

Printing: To print using a variety of media and objects to achieve variations in line, tone, texture, colour and pattern. To use layering techniques to experiment and build texture. To use pattern, shape and designs to create depth.
