Key Vocabulary

Landscape	A painting or picture of scenery/land
Foreground	The things at the front of the picture
Background	What is at the back of the picture.
Hue	The pure colour
Tint	How a colour alters depending upon the amount of white added.
Tone	How a colour alters depending upon the amount of gray added.
Cross-hatching	Shading an area with intersecting sets of parallel lines
Blending	Mixing two colours together
Hatching	Drawing closely spaced parallel lines
Scrumbling	Using curved lines to create tone
Stippling	Using dots to create tone
