City States	Small areas that ancient Greece was divided into, each with their own governments, laws and army
Continent	A large landmass made up of many countries.
Country	An area that is controlled by its own government.
Empire	A group of countries or states that is ruled by one ruler or country.
Human Geography	Features of an environment that have been shaped by people.
Physical Geography	The natural features of a place or environment
Mediterranean	The sea between Europe and North Africa and the countries bordering it.
