

Phonics Intent Statement



At The Merton Primary School, we believe that reading is the key to unlocking the curriculum, enabling both success and enjoyment throughout a child's school journey and beyond. Phonics plays a crucial role in this process, providing the foundation for reading and forming the cornerstone of our reading curriculum.

We use a high-quality and rigorous phonics programme called **Read Write Inc** *. This systematic approach introduces sounds, mnemonics for graphemes, and letter formation, all of which are linked to high-quality books. This engages children and excites them to read for pleasure, fostering a love of books alongside a "phonics first" approach to decoding. By doing so, we ensure a clear and concrete link between phonics and reading.

Our carefully developed long-term plan offers a systematic, synthetic phonics approach, with clearly defined expectations from **Reception to Year 2**, and continuing beyond, to ensure that children continue to grow their phonetic knowledge up to **Year 6**.

We aim to provide teaching and learning experiences that enable children to:

- Rapidly learn the alphabetic code: the 150+ graphemes that represent the 44 speech sounds in English.
- Use simple and enjoyable mnemonics to help them quickly grasp letter-sound correspondences.
- Fluently recognise high-frequency words that are not phonically regular (commonly known as 'red words').
- Enjoy phonically decodable books that are closely matched to their growing phonics and red word knowledge, helping to build confidence and fluency.
- Engage with thought-provoking story introductions, prompts for discussion, and opportunities for 'thinking out loud' to support reading comprehension.
- Enjoy and discuss picture books and novels to build background knowledge and deepen understanding of a wide variety of texts.
